- A. Discussion of deer population in the town
 - 1. Dianne Robinson, WDNR Biologist

Chairman Krause introduced Dianne Robinson, and stated that deer management is a very "explosive" issue in the Town. We are here tonight to take this item up for discussion. This is not a public hearing.

Dianne Robinson, DNR Wildlife Biologist, provided a power point presentation on Urban Deer Management. She identified the specifics of Nonlethal and Lethal management.

Nonlethal: Scare/hazing tactics (motion sensing lights/sprinkler system, hose) remove food source (baiting/feeding ban, taste/odor repellents, deer resistant landscaping) and fencing (4-6' range). Lethal: Sharpshooters (approximately \$100/deer, annual effort, DNR nuisance permit and an experienced professional).

Hunters: broad hunting season, archery, gun, muzzleloader.

Ms. Robinson referenced 2013 Wisconsin Act 71, and suggested the Town review their current ordinance.

She provided information on additional hunting options: DMAP tags, nuisance permit tags (no cost), Learn to Hunt program and mentor events.

Ms. Robinson stated that the preferred deer population for a rural residential area is 20-25 per square mile. The population in Lake Country has become so large that the vegetation in state and county parks is being consumed faster than it can be replenished. Currently, Lapham Peak cannot be hunted but the DNR is

exploring the possibility of allowing limited hunting in some portions of the park. Also, Waukesha County Parks are working to expand hunting.

The results of Chairman Krause's requested vote of those citizens in favor of nonlethal management was 2 and lethal removal management was 4.

This item will be placed on the next Town Board Agenda.

A. Steve Hogan, Hartland Lakeside School District, Re: Improvements at Old School House Rd.

Steve Hogan, spoke on behalf of the Hartland Lakeside School District expressing concerns re: traffic and speed on KE. Due to the development of Woodridge Subdivision and addition of Summerhill, there is a need for a safe passage to North Shore Middle School. The proposed plan includes the addition of a culvert and path between Hwy. KE and the North Shore Park parking lot. Hartland Lakeside School District is requesting funds from the Town to complete this project.

Our new ambulance has arrived and the new engine is expected this August. When the board approved the purchase of the ambulance, they also decided to use Act 102 funds to help pay for it. Community Tree/Shrub Summary

Presented below is a summary of Tree/Shrub disposal programs offered in Towal of Delafield nearby communities along with resident cost information. The information was gathered from the community's web site.

The majority of the communities use an area within their public works yard or recycling center as a drop-off point. A number of them use a remote location. The service is offered generally from spring through fall. Most communities made the site available one to two days per week. The City of Waukesha was an exception, where their site was available 6 days a week. Two communities offer curbside pick-up. Cost information is summarized below.

When doing the search of community websites, I did not come across any communities that did not offer a tree/shrub disposal program. There may be some out there but none surfaced.

I would hope that our Public Works staff and Town Engineer can come up with a series of alternatives to evaluate and a suitable alternative can be established for tree and shrub trimming disposal in the Town in 2019.

In the survey that was recently completed in the High Ridge subdivision, 93% of the respondents favored a tree/shrub disposal site where residents can bring materials on select days, and 67% of the respondents indicated a willingness to purchase an annual disposal permit.


